FNP Role-Specific Competencies

- 1. Translate knowledge from clinical practice and other professions to improve population health outcomes.
- 2. Provide healthcare services within scope of practice boundaries, which include health promotion, disease prevention, anticipatory guidance, counseling, disease management, palliative, and end of life care.
- 3. Demonstrate responsibility to practice in the NP population focus area defined by your education, certification and license.
- 4. Advocate for policies that support population focus NPs to practice at the full extent of their education.
- 5. Provide holistic person-centered care by developing a culturally-informed, mutually acceptable, cost-conscious, and evidence-based plan of care.
- 6. Implement evidence-based guidelines and strategies that enable effective transitions of care and care coordination.
- 7. (Ethically) Use information and communication technology to support documentation of care and communication among providers, patients, and all system levels.
- 8. Analyze data to evaluate interventions, inequities, and gaps in care.
- 9. Demonstrate clinical judgment using a systematic approach to inform, improve, and advance NP practice processes and outcomes.
- 10. Evaluate quality improvement processes and evidence-based outcomes.
